ORDINANCE NO. 20-04-02-41

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 8; CHAPTER 5 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF LE ROY, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Le Roy, McLean County, Illinois, an Illinois municipal corporation, has enacted Municipal Code Regulations for the purpose of improving and protecting the public health, safety, comfort, convenience, and general welfare of the people; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the City Council have previously enacted a long term control plan service fee to offset the cost of separation of the existing combined LeRoy sewer system as mandated by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA); and

WHEREAS, the current ordinance fee schedule of the long term control plan service fee is three dollars and zero cents (\$3.00); and

WHEREAS, a contracted engineering firm has forecasted that the post-monitoring process of the separation will continue for at least two (2) additional years; and

WHEREAS, the City of LeRoy did not have to expend substantial funds for the post-monitoring process in the prior year; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the City Council have determined that it is necessary and in the best interest of the City and its resident that the rates for long term control plan service fee be reduced to twenty-five cents (\$0.25) unless or until additional costs or IEPA requirements are placed on the process; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Le Roy, Illinois in lawful meeting assembled on Monday, April 6, 2020, as follows:

SECTION 1. Title 8 – Water and Sewer, Chapter 5 – Sewer Service Fees and Charges, Section 10 –Long Term Control Plan Service Fee, shall be amended as follows:

§8-5-10 Long Term Control Plan Service Fee.

- A.** Combined Sewer Separation Requirements: The anticipated expense to separate the existing sewer system will include the following Illinois Environmental Protection Agency mandates:
 - 1. Separation of the existing combined sewer system by December 31, 2018. The total estimated cost to complete this project is \$2,000,000.00.
 - 2. Implementation of a post-monitoring process upon completion of the separation project reference above.
- B.** Fee: All utility customers of the City of LeRoy will be required to pay a ~~\$3~~ **twenty-five cent (\$0.25)** per month fee to fund the post-monitoring process mandated by the IEPA.

SECTION 2. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval and publication as required by law.


