AN ORDINANCE ENACTING "AN ACT REGULATING WAGES OF LABORERS, MECHANICS AND OTHER WORKMEN EMPLOYED IN ANY PUBLIC WORKS BY THE STATE, COUNTY, CITY OR ANY PUBLIC BODY OR ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OR BY ANY ONE UNDER CONTRACT FOR PUBLIC WORKS."

Published in pamphlet form by authority of the City Council of the City of Le Roy, McLean County, Illinois, this 15 day of June, 1981.

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workmen employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works, "approved June 26, 1941, as amended, being Section 39s-1 through 39s-12, Chapter 48, Illinois Revised Statutes, 1973, and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the City Council of the City of Le Roy investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workmen in the locality of said City employed in performing construction of public works, for said City exclusive of maintenance work.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LE ROY:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workmen employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works, "approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workmen engaged in the construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of this City is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in McLean County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June, 1981 a copy of that determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of this City to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3. The City Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the ~~main~~ office of this City this determination of such prevailing rate of wage.

SECTION 4. The City Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed, or file their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workmen whose wages will be affected by such rates.


SECITON 5: The City Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with both the Secretary of State and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.



Current Addendum to Agreement dated August 1, 1980 between LOCAL PLASTERING CONTRACTORS' and OPERATIVE PLASTERERS' AND CEMENTS MASONS' INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION, LOCAL 152, of the counties of McLean, portions of Woodford, DeWitt, and Livingston in the State of Illinois.

- (a) The Working Dues Check Off AND the Building Trades Dues Check Off are to be deducted from the above rates and transmitted to the proper Fund as stated below under Working Dues Check Off and Building Trades Dues Check Off.

WORKING DUES CHECK-OFF:

Effective August 1, 1980, each EMPLOYER agrees to deduct from the above wages and pay to the Operative Plasterers and Cement Masons International Association - Local 152 General Fund, a sum equal to seventeen cents (\$.17) per hour for all hours worked by an employee covered by this Agreement, provided that the EMPLOYER has received a proper and lawful assignment by the employee. The sums deducted should be in the fund account by the fifteenth (15th) day of the month following the month in which the deductions were made. Make check payable to: Local 152 General Fund - Acct. #166-456-20. Attach the check to the white copy of the form and mail to:

Said failure to make the required payment by the EMPLOYER at the time specified shall be deemed a gross breach of the Agreement by the EMPLOYER and the UNION shall be free to take any economic action, including refusal of employees to work and picketing, to obtain EMPLOYER compliance with this Agreement, notwithstanding any other provisions of this Agreement. Said non-compliance with this paragraph shall add to the contribution due from any EMPLOYER, a substantial penalty of not less than ten per cent (10%) of the amount due for failure of such EMPLOYER to make prompt payment of any contribution required under the terms of the collective bargaining agreement with the UNION.

There shall be a seventy-five (\$.75) cent an hour premium for the application of handling of all epoxy coatings.

Overtime and all other rates above base rates shall apply to Apprentices. The hourly rate for flagpoles, smoestacks, water tanks and work above sixty (60) feet shall be determined by the individual demand of the Journeyman, employed on the work, provided the scale is higher than the high work rate. All overtime work and Saturdays will be paid at the rate of time and one-half. Sundays and Holidays will be paid at the rate of double time.

WAGES

Classification Group I - Drivers on 2 axle trucks hauling less than 9 ton. Air compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those pulled by separate units, truck driver helpers, warehousemen, mechanic helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks when hauling material, tools or men to and from and on the job site, and fork lifts up to 6,000 lb. capacity. Effective: 5/1/81 \$13.05.

Classification Group II - 2 or 3 axle trucks hauling more than 9 ton but hauling less than 16 ton. A-frame winch trucks, hydrolift trucks, or similar equipment when used for transportation purposes. Fork lifts over 6,000 lb. capacity, winch trucks, and four axle combination units. In the event the Employer desires to use ticket writers that classification shall come under Group II. 

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workmen employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works, "approved June 26, 1941, as amended, being Section 39s-1 through 39s-12, Chapter 48, Illinois Revised Statutes, 1973, and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the City Council of the City of Le Roy investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workmen in the locality of said City employed in performing construction of public works, for said City exclusive of maintenance work.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LE ROY:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workmen employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works, "approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workmen engaged in the construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of this City is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in McLean County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June, 1981 a copy of that determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of this City to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.


SECTION 3. The City Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of this City this determination of such prevailing rate of wage.

SECTION 4. The City Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed, or file their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workmen whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The City Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with both the Secretary of State and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall be effective upon its passage and approval, and publication, as required by law, and such publication shall constitute notice that the determination is effective and this is the determination of this public body.
