Dear Juanita:

By legislation passed in late 1979, effective January 1, 1980, each municipality in the State of Illinois during the month of June of each calendar year must investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages to be paid for work on public works and most post or keep available such determination of the prevailing wages, as well as file a certified copy of the findings made by the municipality in the office of the Secretary of State in Springfield. This legislation, Chapter 48, Paragraphs 39s-1 through 39s-12, also provides, under 39s-4, that a municipality may request the Department of Labor in the State of Illinois to ascertain the prevailing rate of wages.

Enclosed please find the original and four copies of the ordinance for the City of LeRoy for the adoption of the prevailing wage rate for public works to be constructed within the city. Please have this ordinance adopted by the City Council at your next meeting. By state law, every municipality in the State of Illinois must adopt a prevailing wage ordinance during the month of June of each year.

After this ordinance has been adopted, please return one fully executed copy to me to keep in my file. You will also need to send one certified copy of the ordinance to the Office of the Secretary of State and one certified copy to the Department of Labor, both in Springfield, Illinois.

Although this ordinance must be published in some fashion, it may be published by a short notice in the newspaper indicating that the ordinance is published in pamphlet form and indicating that the pamphlets are available at certain places during normal business hours for viewing by the public.

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE PREVAILING WAGE RATE FOR PUBLIC WORKS OF THE CITY OF LEROY, ILLINOIS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of LeRoy, Illinois:

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workmen employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works", approved June 26, 1941, as amended, being Section 39s-1 through 39s-12, Chapter 48, Illinois Revised Statutes, 1973, and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the Mayor and City Council of the City of LeRoy investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workmen in the locality of said City of LeRoy employed in performing construction of public works, for said City of LeRoy, exclusive of maintenance work,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEROY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workmen employed by any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works", approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workmen engaged in the construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of this City of LeRoy, Illinois, is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in McLean County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June of 1985, a copy of that determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of this City of LeRoy, Illinois, to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3. The City Clerk for the City of LeRoy shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of this City of LeRoy, Illinois, this determination of such prevailing rate of wage.

SECTION 4. The City Clerk of the City of LeRoy shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed, or file their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workmen whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5. The City Clerk of the City of LeRoy shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with both the Secretary of State and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall be full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as required by law.







Air compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those pulled by separate units, truck driver helpers, warehousemen, mechanic helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks when hauling material, tools, or men to and from and on the job site, and fork lifts up to 6,000 lb. capacity.

Class 2. Two or three axle trucks hauling more than 9 ton but hauling less than 16 ton. A-frame winch trucks, hydrolift trucks, or similar equipment when used for transportation purposes. Fork lifts over 6,000 lb. capacity, winch trucks, and four axle combination units.

In the event the Employer desires to use ticket writers that classification shall come under Class 2.

Class 3. Two, three or four axle trucks hauling 16 ton or more. Drivers on water pulls, mechanics and working foremen.

Five axle or more combination units.

In the event the Employer desires to use dispatchers that classification shall come under Class 3.

Class 4. Low Boy and Oil Distributors.
